About the Commission:

The purpose of the Commission is:

- To adopt, recommend or rescind rules for regulation of most health care facilities. (hospitals, hospices, free standing outpatient surgical facilities, nursing homes, home care agencies, home health agencies, nursing pools, facilities providing mammography/pap smear services, ambulances, and emergency medical services personnel)
- To administer the Health Care Facilities Finance Act Link goes outside of N.C. DHHS.; which
 enables the Commission to issue tax-exempt revenue bonds to finance construction and
 equipment projects for nonprofit and public hospitals, nursing homes, continuing care facilities
 for the elderly and facilities related to the foregoing.

Appointee Term: 4 years

NCMS Seats: 3

Appointing Authority:

The North Carolina Medical Care Commission of the Department of Health and Human Services shall consist of 17 members appointed by the Governor. Three of the members appointed by the Governor shall be nominated by the North Carolina Medical Society.

Commission Meetings:

Meetings are held quarterly in February, May, August, and November.

Appointee Expectations:

Appointees are expected to prepare for, attend, and participate in the meetings.
